

Nepal Earthquake and FIG Commission 2/ISPRS Workshop Kathmandu, November 2015

In the weeks before the FIG Working Week in Sofia, Nepal has been hit by two severe earthquakes. While preparing for the FIG Commission 2/ISPRS joint workshop in November, the local organisers were confronted with this dramatic situation and its consequences for their families and livelihoods. FIG Commission 2 wishes the Nepalese local organising committee, and the organisations they represent, all the strength needed to overcome this difficult situation. Special thoughts are with our Nepalese FIG Commission 2 member, Working Group 2.1: Reshma Shrestha.

The local organising committee guided by Ganesh Prasad Bhatta, Deputy Director General, Survey Department, Ministry of Land Reform and Management, Government of Nepal, expressed the intention to continue with the organisation of the FIG Commission 2/ISPRS workshop in November. Suggestions to change the focus of the workshop have been considered. Given the situation in Nepal, disaster recovery, post disaster reconstruction planning and the role of geo-information are proposed new themes. Impression Technical Session TS06F Joint Commission 1 and 2 Session on Capacity Needs and Continuous Professional Development:

There were 6 papers in session ranging across 3 continents: Asia, Europe and Africa and all attendees at this session were invited to participate in WG 2.2 in the future.

Key highlights included the investment in Human Resources in both Sweden and The Netherlands. In the Lantmäteriet in Sweden significant resources have been set aside to ensure a sustainable recruitment process. These include mentoring programmes with industry, surveying ambassadors and defining relevant research for industry, whereas in The Netherlands emphasis has been placed on defining best practise in training development for current surveyors.

Key discoveries included the development of a new Certification Programme in Malaysia in Underground Utility Detection which merges elements from electricity, geophysics and mapping. In addition, the trials and tribulations of the Botswana Surveying and Mapping Association emergence were outlined.

A passionate presentation from our Nigerian colleague outlined the importance of engaging the young and marketing the profession to the youth in Africa to ensure a future of the profession.
