Dear President Foster and Member s of the FIG Council,

Bid to host FIG Working Week 2007

During the FIG Working Week 2001 in Seoul, we were really honoured when you, President Foster, and Mr. Markku Villikka, Director of FIG, proposed and invited The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors to bid and host the FIG Working Week 2007 in Hong Kong. We have brought the message back and presented this to our General Council. The President and the General Council of the HKIS endorsed the proposal with full support and the greatest enthusiasm. The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors has committed to make the FIG Working Week 2007 in Hong Kong a success.

An Organizing Committee was then formed comprising of active and senior members of the four main divisions of the Institute, namely Building Surveying Division, General Practice Division (Estate and Valuation); Land Surveying Division; and Quantity Surveying Division (Estimators and Cost Engineers). Our young and energetic Junior Organisation (JO) who gives us trendy and innovative thoughts and ideas joined forces in the Organizing Committee. In short, all members of our Institute are fully supportive and committed to hosting the FIG Working Week 2007 in Hong Kong.

Moreover, the Hong Kong Tourism Board and the Planning and Lands Bureau of the Hong Kong Government are also excited and have confirmed their full backing and support to HKIS in hosting this event.

We hope you will find the attached Bidding Submission informative of our ideas for the event. Nevertheless, we would highlight the followings:-

The year 2007 will have a significant meaning to Hong Kong as it will be the 10th anniversary of the return of the former British Colony to China.

We believe there will be many surveyors around the world having tremendous interest to see for themselves how the concept of "One Country, Two Systems" has been operating in Hong Kong.



There will be tours arranged for the delegates to visit the Mainland China to extend their experience of "One Country, Two Systems" after the Working Week. They will be able to find out more about China after 6 years of membership with the World Trade Organization.

We hope that by 2007, the other disciplines of the surveying profession, such as the appraisers and cost engineers, of Mainland China could have joined FIG and would participate in such first FIG Working Week in China. We understand that your Commissions 9 and 10 are working hard on this.

With the support of the Hong Kong Tourist Board and various institutions, we would be able to generate a reasonable budget that charges only US\$550 for the full delegates of the Working Week. This charge will include free shuttle transportation between the conference venue and the official hotels. We also propose to include lunches in the basic charges. Similarly, the Technical Tours will be of a package with transportation and meal included.

If there is a surplus in the final account of the event, this will be shared equally between HKIS and FIG. Yet, in appreciation and recognition of the effort and contribution of FIG to the surveying profession, the General Council of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors has decided to underwrite the royalty to the FIG and FIG Foundation in the amount of HK\$40,000 (about US\$5,130).

All in all, we will endeavour and are committed to work for the success of FIG Working Week 2007 in Hong Kong.

We are also prepared to send a delegation to Washington in April 2002 to present our proposals to the General Assembly of the Federation.

Theme of the FIG Working Week 2007 Hong Kong

STRATEGIC INTEGRATION OF SURVEYING SERVICES

Today, the surveying services provided by professional surveyors are of different cultural, social and customary background. To great extents the efficiency and effectiveness of these services are very much dependent on the availability of new technology, methodology and concepts to the surveying groupings and individual surveyors. Some of the poor and underdeveloped countries are still using the very basic and conventional tools and methodology whereas some rich countries are using the most advanced instrumentation and technology. They are different in standards and the services provided may not be complete. There is an urgent need for improvement and coordination.

We all talk about Globalization and WTO. Modern telecommunications and transportation facilities have enabled international professional surveyors to move and work closer to exhange ideas and share experience in the field of surveying. International professional surveyors should work towards an integrated surveying service such that all surveyors can live in harmony. International professional surveyors should work together to produce a service that is sustainable and beneficial not only to fellow surveyors but also to the communities and public. We should work towards standardization and integrate our surveying services and provide them to the users with minimum cost and time but giving maximum benefits and good value for money.

In the other dimension of the surveying profession, the wide scope of the practice, ranging from cadastre, GIS to planning, development and appraisal of real estate has caused diversification of interests and resources both inside and outside the profession. Perhaps it is high time we reviewed the roles and practices of the surveying profession vis-à-vis the changing demand for the surveying services in the global economic outlook.

The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors shall endeavour to provide a venue for a forum on these issues and wish to call upon all fellow professional surveyors round the world (whether or not they are members of a surveying association) to come, participate and share their ideas, experience and vision in order to produce an integrated surveying service strategically.





Hence there is the theme Strategic Integration of Surveying Services for the FIG Working Week 2007 Hong Kong.

It is anticipated that because of the locational advantage, the FIG Working Week 2007 in Hong Kong, being the first one in China can attract significant participation from Mainland China and also the Far East countries. A reduced registration fee has been designated for such participants as encouragement. Students will also enjoy a much subsidised rate.

Duration and Timing

The proposed dates for the Working Week is the first week of July 2007. There will be ceremonial events and all forms of celebrations to mark the 10th anniversary of the return of Hong Kong to China.
