For the academic research grant FIG Foundation received four applications, however they were all rejected due to the fact that they did not fulfil the requirements.





FIG Grants 2018

Together with UN-Habitat/Global Land Tool Network (GLTN) the FIG Young Surveyors introduced a new pilot programme in 2017 – Volunteer Community Surveyor program (VCSP). This programme made it possible for young surveyors to apply for an exchange and to contribute to projects that GLTN is involved in at country levels implementing land tools. This project was supported by FIG Foundation of 5,000 EUR. Expenses were included in the 2017 accounting, however most of the expenses were held in 2018.


