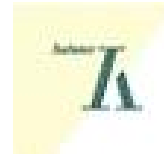

complexity of land tenure concepts



- § dual systems of western style ownership and customary concepts of tenure based on group ownership
- § 31 of 44 adopted individual ownership as official tenure while 36 have de facto customary tenure
- § legal pluralism



Land tenure security



- § Different perceptions of land tenure security
- § Customary rules create normative system equal to written law
- § Land tenure and social safety net
- § Tragedy of the commons vs tragedy of the individuals
- § Replacement paradigm vs. adaption paradigm



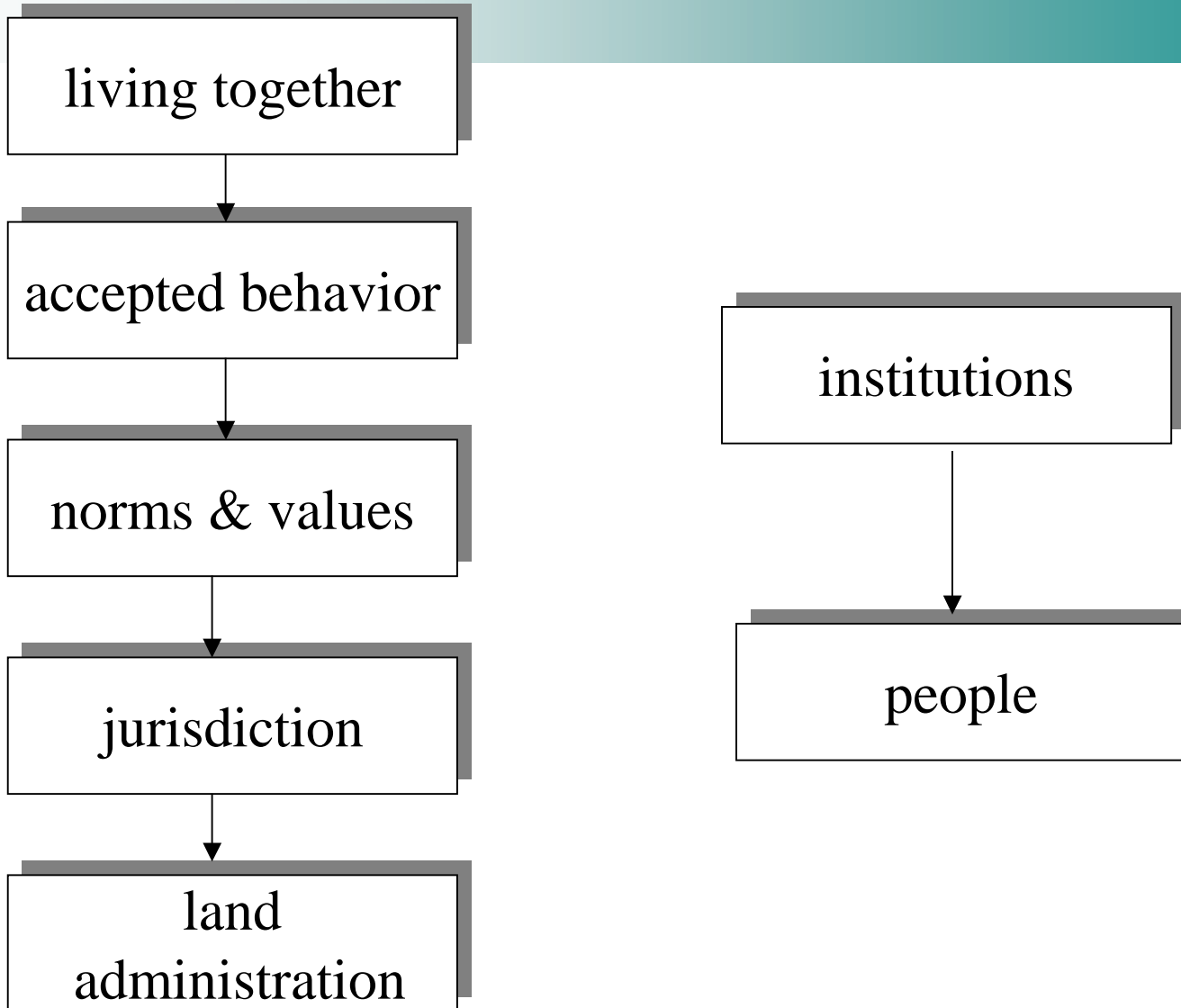
Results



- § Excessive slow progress
- § Land records no resemblance to reality
- § Registration exacerbates uncertainty and conflicts
- § Threatens customary right holders
- § Titling does not reallocate land in most efficient way

- § Primary lease, demarcated lease and qualified lease
- § Relief from eviction
- § Self help registers
- § Handheld GPS
- § Sdi priority SOK
