#### Reasons for introduction

- · Increased number of foreign students
  - Prior to the autumn term of 2009 -120 000 applications
  - Last decade a number of foreign students tripled to 36000 in 2008/2009
- Increased costs for the government
- Competition with other universities based on quality of education



#### Tuition fees in Sweden

- By the government bill (2009/10:65)
- As of the autumn term 2011
- For BSc and MSc students (PhD is free of charge)
- Exception for students from of EU/EEA states and Switzerland
- 12 000-24 000 € annually depending on educational programs

#### Scholarship programs

1. Countries of long-term development cooperation with Sweden:

Bangladesh, Bolivia, Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Cambodia, Kenya, Mali, Mozambique, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia

- Covers tuition fees and living costs
- 1. Other countries outside the EU/EEA
  - Covers tuition fees only



#### Effects of tuition fees

- A sharp decrease of students
  - Students outside EU/EES from 16000-1200
- Risk for shortage of qualified labour for industry
  - A large retirement and aging of population
- Abolishment of range of educational programs
- Increased direct and indirect costs for managing tuition-fee students
- More engaged students


