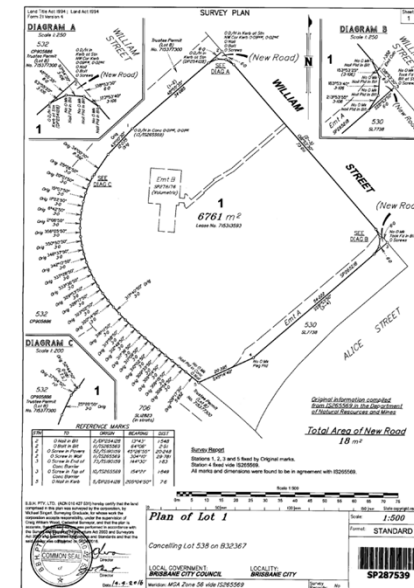

The cadastre in Queensland

- Torrens titling
- Survey plans are point of truth for dimension and area
- The integrity of the cadastre
- Legislation
- Maintaining and improving cadastral boundaries throughout the State

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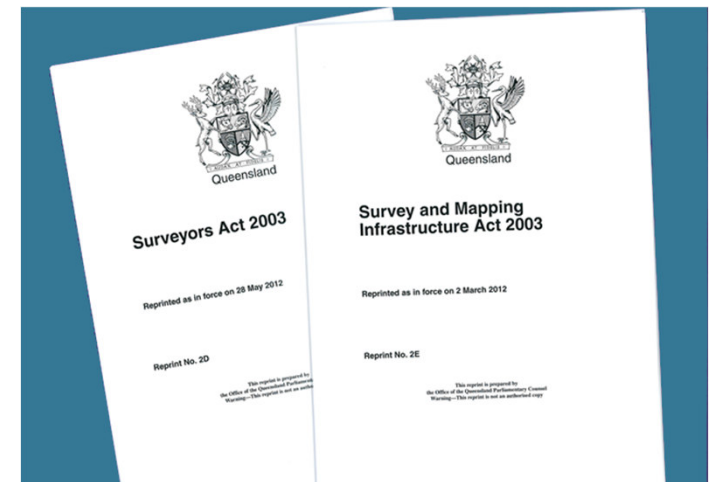
The compliance framework

Purpose: Maintain and improve the integrity of the cadastre.

Key components – all work together.

- Registration of Surveyors – Surveyors Board of Queensland (SBQ)
- Set surveying standards – Cadastral Survey Requirements (CSR) and Survey Requirements for Mining Tenures (SRMT)
- Survey auditing program
- Industry engagement and education (conferences and seminars, surveying alerts)
- Provide survey advice

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Historical auditing

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Plan examination

- Unchanged since 1990s
- Basic examination of **all** plans submitted
- Plans could not progress until passed
- Suitable for many years
- Need for change:
 - Number of examinations unsustainable
 - Very few in-depth examinations
 - Field examinations became very rare
 - Identification surveys excluded

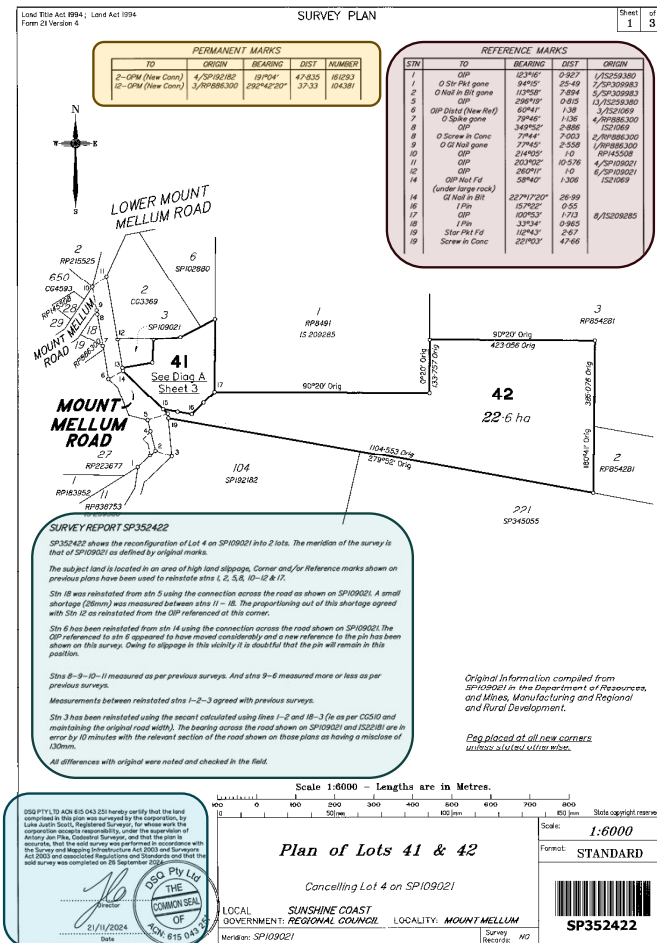

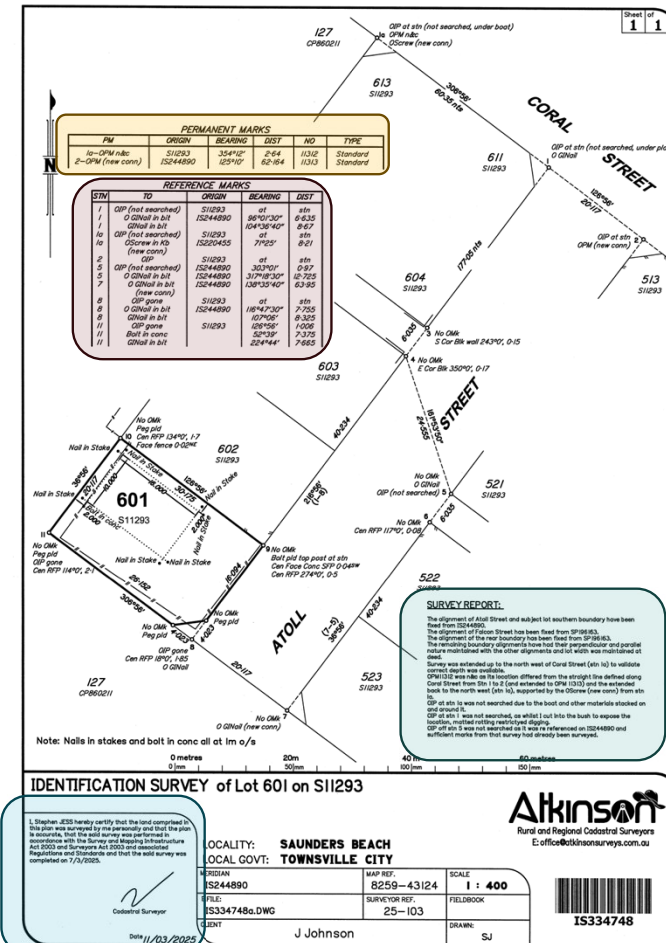

5 Allocations (sheet 2) (existing title)		
5.1 Are there multiple Original Grants?		
5.2 Are there multiple existing titles and the plan creates multiple (1-1) new Lots?		
5.3 Are there multiple existing titles with any existing Secondary Interests?		
5.4 Is there only one existing title with an existing partial Secondary Interest and the plan creates multiple (1-1) new Lots?		
5.5 Is there only one existing title with an existing easement Secondary Interest and the plan creates multiple (1-1) new Lots?		
5.6 Is there only one existing title with an existing Easement of Land and the plan creates 10 or more Lots?		
6 Physical Feature Boundary		
6.1 Does the plan have any physical feature (non-right line) boundaries? (SMA Act)

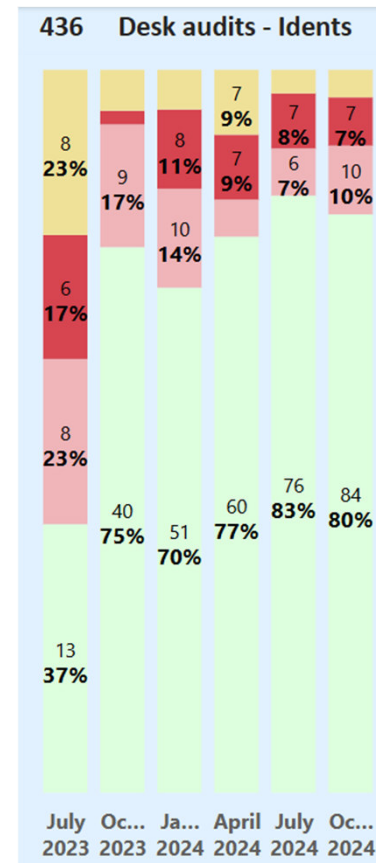
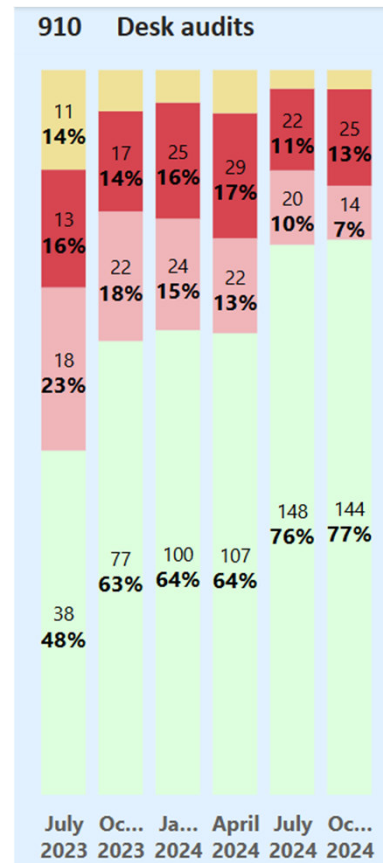
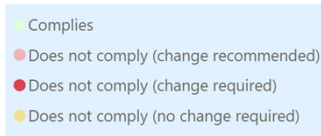


Audit results to date 1 of 3

Improving compliance

- Desk audits improved from 48% to 77% compliance*
- Idents improved from 37% to 80% compliance*

* 18 months of audit results (quarterly)

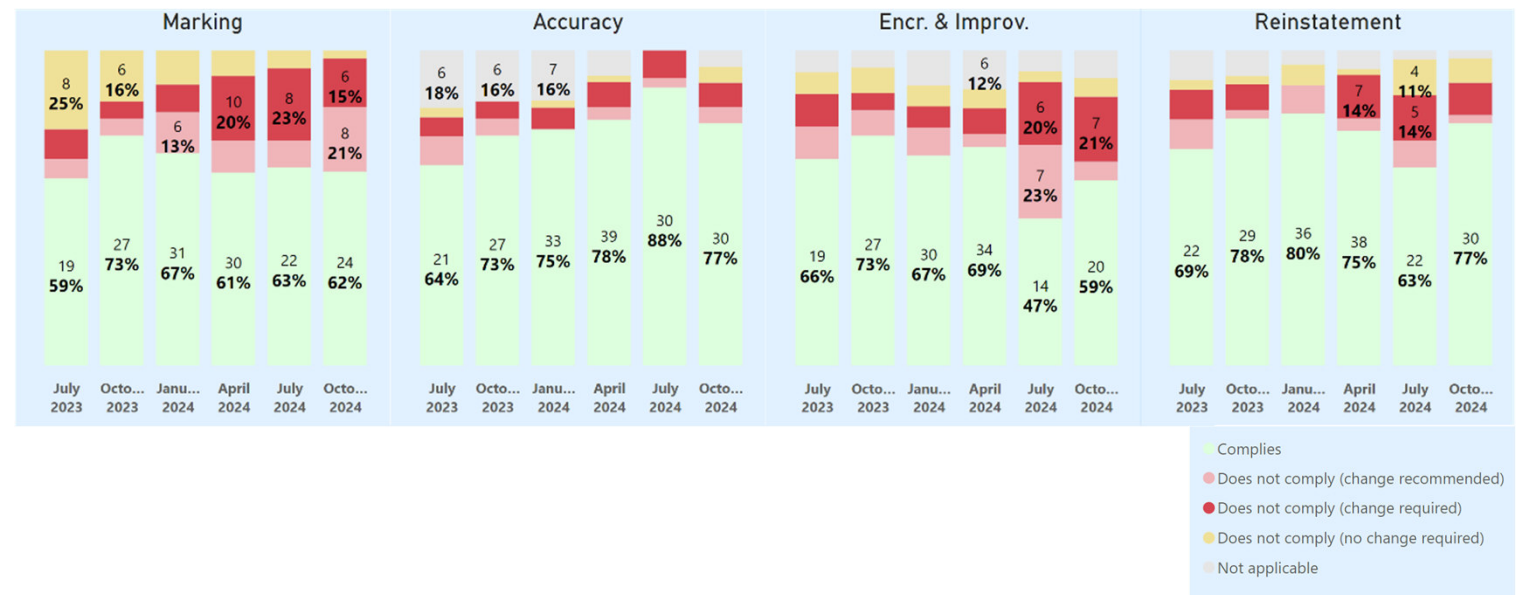
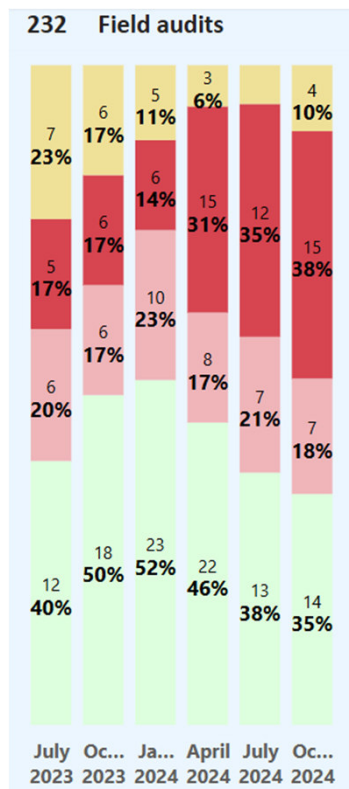


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Audit results to date 2 of 3

Lower compliance – Field work*

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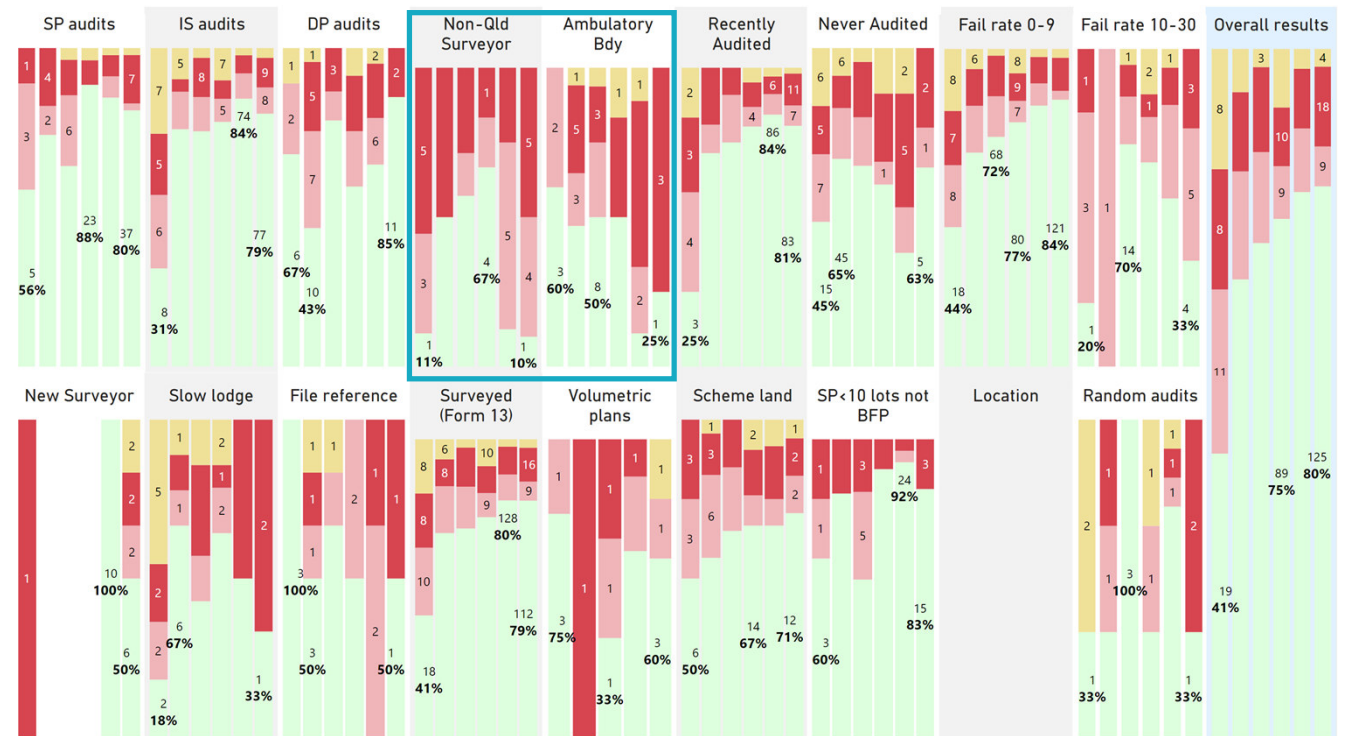
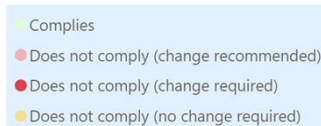
* 18 months of audit results (quarterly)

- Surveys with a physical feature (ambulatory) boundary

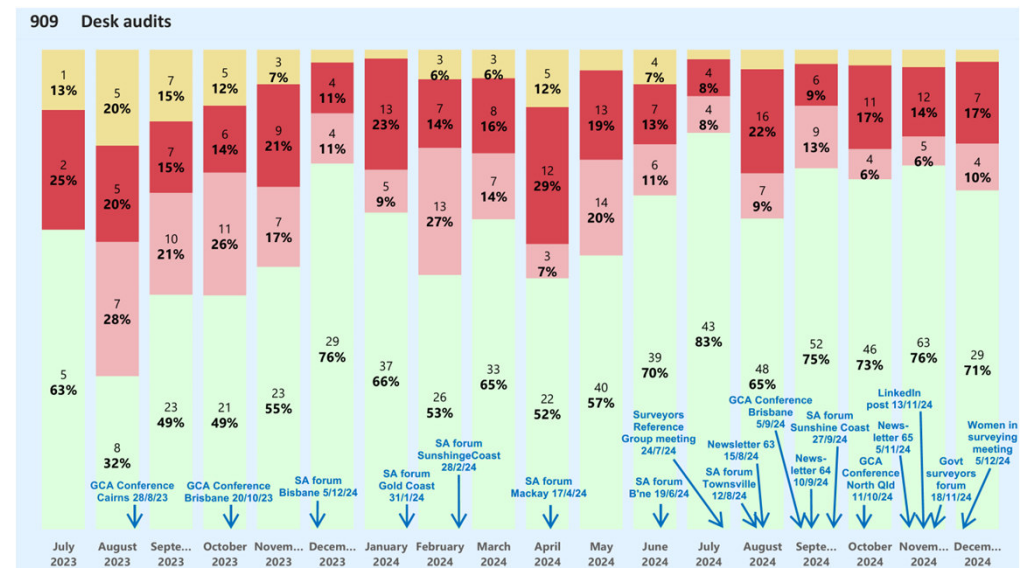
